Go And Tell the Story

Christ is Risen! He is Risen, indeed!

Its Easter! The tomb is empty, and Jesus has appeared to the disciples saying "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation…" Sharing the story of Jesus is an ongoing conversation: From the announcement of his birth, through the amazed responses of folks who witnessed his healings and the raising of Lazarus, to the those who listened to his teachings and the parables he told, and now those who are hearing, for the first time, that the tomb is not strong enough to hold the mystery and the wonder of God in the world.

There is so much to tell about the life and the ministry of Jesus. Plus, when you add the history and traditions of the Jewish faith from which Jesus emerged, you can go on and on, rehearsing the never-ending story of how God is present with God's people again and again, as the world continues to unfold. But where do we start? What parts of the story hold the most awe and wonder for you? And what setting do we need in order to be comfortable sharing this story with others? Does it feel as comfortable talking to your friends about a bible story you have read in your morning devotions, as it would if you were talking about the latest New York Times bestselling novel?

Telling the story of God's love, proclaimed through Jesus, and lived out through the power of the Spirit can feel a bit overwhelming, but it can be as simple as sharing one of your favorite songs, or discussing a story you read in your morning devotions. The women at the empty tomb, and the disciples in the upper room began their stories after seeing Jesus alive and among them. Perhaps that is a good place for us to start, too. Where do you see the healing love of God active in your life? What questions do you have that you would like to ask God? What experiences have you had of others showing God's love to you?

Perhaps you could share a favorite song that speaks to the story of God's love. My grandmother's favorite hymn was "I Love to Tell the Story", and though she died when I was only six years old, I still have vivid memories of her singing this hymn over and over again as I helped her bake pies, or change the sheets on the beds. Her evangelism wasn't as obvious as the pastor's preaching sermons on TV, but she made a huge impression on me, just sharing her favorite hymn as she went about her everyday life.


Maybe sharing that hymn with my Grandmother influenced one of my own favorite hymns that I now sing with my grandson at Christmastime "Go Tell it on the Mountain." I sang it a lot as a kid in the youth choir, and as an adult, I especially enjoy the James Taylor version of this song on his album of Christmas music (you can hear it here: https://youtube.com/watch?v=mlak9WRXERg). This hymn is considered a Christmas song because it is announcing the birth of Jesus, but I think it could be a song that is appreciated any time of the year, and does a good job of showing us God 's love through the gift of a child, who through the Spirit, is continually engaging us and drawing us close. The James Taylor version says it this way:

Yes, I was a seeker,
I sought him both night and day

Asked the Lord to help me. He showed me the way.

Down in a manger
The humble child was born.
God sent salvation on that Christmas morn.

Go, tell it on the mountain, Over the hills and everywhere; Go, tell it on the mountain That Jesus is born.



Once the song is in your head, it's easy to tell God's story, just by recounting some of your favorite experiences of sharing God's love, at Christmas time, Easter morning, or any time of the year. So, sing out, gather your friends and family, and tell the story through the love you share with one another. This is the heart of God, being proclaimed within the everyday lives we lead.

Opening

St. John's Lutheran Church Council met Monday, March 18, 2024 at 6;30 pm at the church. Attending were Larry Wennekamp, Dave Groteluschen, Brian Bunkers, JoAnne Marxsen and Karol Swan. Denise Stevenson and Pastor Chris Alexander were unable to attend. President Larry Wennekamp called the meeting to order and opened with a prayer.

The minutes from February meeting were read and approved by Brian seconded by Dave. Motion Carried

Karol went over the end of February financial reports. Motion to approve was made by Dave, seconded by JoAnne. Motion Carried.

- -The radio add on St. John's Easter is on track for airing.
- -The Ecumenical Service for March 20 is going as planned. St. John's will be serving. Pastor Chris is arranging the meal; some members will help serve.
- -Confirmed plans for the March 24 Confirmation reception. Council members will help serve the reception following the morning service.
- -For Easter Sunrise service, the food sign-up is full. Tables will be set up and decorated. JoAnne said that Rose Runge has the Egg Hunt ready to go.
- -At this time council decided to not pursue an usher sigh-up system and continue to ask for volunteers.

New Business

- "Meet the Confirmands" was read. Brian moved to accept, Larry seconded and all approved to accept our 2 Confirmation Students as new members. Welcome Karley Jo Killham and Benjamin Patrick Rocheford.
- -Larry will talk to Pat and take care of updating paperwork for Pastor Chris' contract for Transitional ministry.
- Larry suggested an informal Study Session to be scheduled to discuss Pastor options, congregation future needs, ideas, keeping current, etc. The Council possibly meeting with Pastor Chris outside of a council meeting.

Pastor's Report to the Church Council March 2024

The gatherings with our ecumenical partners for Wednesday Lenten Lunches are going well and introducing us to everyday spiritual practices such as reading and dwelling in the word, taking sabbath rests, and feasting together through sharing meals and celebrating communion together. It's been a terrific conversation so far, and St John's is preparing to serve the luncheon meal to the group on March 20.

Sign-up sheets for the Easter Breakfast are up, and planning for the Easter Egg hunt are underway. We have radio announcements for our Holy week services that are playing throughout the month, and all are invited to

celebrate with us on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter morning, so feel free to invite friends and family to join us.

We have only 2 confirmation lessons left, before we publicly Affirm the Baptism of our students, and they receive their first communion, on Palm Sunday, March 24 during our worship service. Each of the students have chosen a bible verse and have written a personal faith statement to complete their studies after two years of working through the confirmation curriculum on the Bible, the creeds, the Lord's prayer, and Lutheran theology. I have enjoyed working with these students, sharing stories and experiences of how God is active in their lives.

We have been blessed to have Jackson Moore, our Parish Ministry Associate in training, practicing his preaching with us, and gathering feedback from folks in the congregation and his mentor, to grow his skills in this area. We are happy to support Jackson as he continues to learn and grow in his leadership abilities.

I continue to visit and share communion with folks who are unable to join us for worship on Sunday mornings, and we hosted the funeral and reception for Janet Salak, who was buried at Calvary Cemetery.

Wednesday night bible studies on the parables continue through Lent, and then we will return to studying the Old Testament with Professor Craig Koester from Luther Seminary on Monday nights.

And VBS planning is gearing up and gathering resources to provide a great experience for students from May 28 -31. Feel free to invite friends, family and neighbors to join us this year as we celebrate a "Food Truck Party – On a Roll with God!"

The days are growing longer and the light is much appreciated as we continue our Lenten journey's preparing for the wonder and the mystery of Easter Sunrise.

- -Property Committee-Discussed possibilities for pest control in and around the building. We will talk to cleaning staff to decide actions to take. Discussion if the church needs a lawn service for turf care. Brian will call for bids. Noted we have volunteers to do the mowing.


