The "Go And..." theme for August is **Share Your Story**, and they are inviting us to share something ourselves with others, so I thought I would share something about my faith formation with you this month.

In the community where I grew up, most of my friends were either Catholic or Jewish. Outside of my home congregation, I never really met any Lutherans, and I knew only a few folks who were from the Mainline Protestant churches, like Presbyterians or Methodists. By the time I reached the age of confirmation, I was also starting my first real dating experience. His name was Richard and we were in the same 7th grade homeroom. Richard's family happened to be Jewish, but neither of us saw our religious differences as a problem. We were best friends and our dates consisted of hanging out with our shared group of friends, going to movies, riding bikes, and hanging out at the swimming clubs during the summers. Religion was never really a point of conversation for any of us, except each year when Richard and some of our other friends had to miss school for their Jewish High Holy Days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Then we would talk about the difference between his Jewish faith and my Christian traditions, but those differences were considered just a point of information, and were not seen as a something that effected our friendship in any way that mattered.

It wasn't until I started asking questions during my confirmation class that I began to understand the issues surrounding the differences in our faith traditions. In confirmation, my Pastor explained the Kingdom of God to us as that special place we are invited to be through our faith in Jesus Christ. And it dawned on me that Richard's family believed that Jesus was a prophet, but did not believe that Jesus was the Christ, and therefore might not be a part of this kingdom my Pastor was describing. So I asked my Pastor if Richard and my other Jewish friends were also a part of this Kingdom of God. He told me that they would need to change their faith and confess that Jesus was the Messiah, Son of God, the Christ, before they could participate in the Kingdom that was promised.

As you can imagine, this did not sit well in my 7th grade heart or head. Why would the God who loved everyone, not want my friends to be a part of the Kingdom? So, I challenged my Pastor pretty regularly during our classes together about why a God of love would exclude some people from the promises of the Kingdom, especially since the Old Testament tells us that the Jewish People were God's *Chosen* People. I never received a satisfactory answer, and my faith in this "God of Love" started to fade. One of the things I learned early in my friendships, was that, if you had a friend who asked you to choose between them and any of your other friends, you should pick the friend who didn't make you choose. How then could I choose between God and my friends? My friends, won. After confirmation, I never went back to my home congregation.

This time in my life was very formative in my religious understanding, so when I began asking questions about God and spirituality in my college religion classes, I always led with this question on inclusion and acceptance of faith traditions beyond Christianity. I still never got an answer. But, here, I was given even more questions to ask about God and was invited to explore more and more about how God is active in our world. This exploration set me on a life-long discovery of the relationship between God and humanity. And I know that this 7th grade experience was one of the main things that drove my passion for participating in the Tri-Faith Initiative here in Omaha. Isn't is amazing how seeds planted, even in rocky ground, can still grow when showered in love?

Just so you know... Richard and I dated for four more years, and have remained friends. We still don't talk much about the specifics of our religious traditions, but we do both understand that we are beloved children of God, and that is enough.

Minutes/Financial Reports
