BE CHURCH

What does it mean to be church? This is an "age-old," as well as a "never-ending" question, right? We need to be asking this question every day, just as those who first gathered to seek God and be in communion with one another, asked it.

Whenever anyone asks me that question, I tend to re-phrase it a bit and ask instead, "How can I be the church in the world?" because it seems to me that we are created into community and therefore have "church" or community, as the very nature of who we are. So, the question then becomes "how might we live into the community we have been created to be?"

There is so much need out in the world, that sometimes it feels overwhelming. Consider the Middle East, for example. How are we in community with those created persons in Israel and Palestine? How are we to be in community with the millions of created persons who live in the multitude of tent cities across the world, because they have been forced from their homelands? How are we in to be in community with the created ecosystems that are struggling all around us as the climate changes, and the temperature of our planet continues to warm?

Being in community in the face of all the struggling and suffering, is, in fact, what it means to be church. So **HOW** do we do this? We turn to one another. We help wherever, and however, we can. We look to our closest neighbor, just one person at a time, and tell our stories, have a conversation, and see how we might come alongside them, to both give, and receive, support from one another. In turning to each another, we acknowledge that we are not alone, and that each of us has the light of God within us to share with the whole of creation. So start close in - reach outside of yourself and get to know someone else. Be community together.

You won't know the needs of your neighbor until you take the time to **be** a neighbor. This starts with a conversation, an opening up to someone close by, being vulnerable in sharing something of yourself with them, and then following the ripples that move out from there. Caring for the climate and earth's resources could be as simple as planting a tree, or committing to setting up a recycling center in your area, or choosing paper instead of plastic in the grocery store. Every little thing helps. Every action toward caring for your neighbor and the



earth around us, matters. This is how we are the church: loving one another, unconditionally as God loves us. Being church is who we are. Being church is how we love God. Go and be the church.

Larry Wennekamp called the meeting to order. Pastor Chris led us in prayer.

The minutes from March meeting were read and approved by Brian, seconded by Dave. Motion Carried.

Karol went over the end of March financial reports. Motion to approve was made by Dave seconded by JoAnne. Motion carried.

Then we entered Holy week with an Easter service for our friends at Prairie Village, Communion visits with our members at Meridian Gardens, a Maundy Thursday service with guest preacher Rev. Dr. Scott Frederickson, an Ecumenical Good Friday service with our sister churches in Columbus held at Grace Episcopal, and then a Good Friday service in our own space that evening with a dramatic reading of the Passion story. Then Easter morning brought a grand celebration of the Risen Christ with a Sunrise service followed by a terrific breakfast together and an Easter Egg Hunt for the kids! We hosted many extended families of our members, and got to meet and greet many new faces throughout the week. What a whirlwind of Worship and fellowship with our members and neighbors!

As we step into the final weeks of our program year together, I will continue visits with our members living in residential facilities in Columbus, and those for whom attending church on Sunday mornings is a struggle. Planning for VBS is happening and I will continue to visit with the Sunday School children on Sunday mornings.

This month I am presenting the Bible Study for the Women of the ELCA at their Spring Gathering in Grand Island, and will be attending a dinner for the Columbus Chamber of Commerce where St John's will be recognized for 15 years of partnership with the Columbus Community.

We are also preparing to recognize our seniors who are graduate this year from either High School or College, and plan a service to thank all of our teachers, musicians and volunteers who have helped us throughout our program year at St Johns.


