This is a **HUGE** month for St John's! There is so much going on... both inside and outside of our church walls! All of the programs for the congregation start up again the week of September 10 – Sunday School, Confirmation, all the Choirs, and a new Adult Bible Study on Monday nights. And, to top everything off – It is our annual "God's Work. Our Hands." Sunday. Our Event this year is to host a huge, community-wide spaghetti dinner to gather all of our neighbors for some fun and fellowship.

We have several committees working on this project to involve the whole congregation, in serving one another and serve our community. The Social Ministry committee is heading planning the event, providing for all the resources needed, and us together in service. Stewardship and Evangelism are working

August 21, 2023 Meeting Minutes

Opening

St. John's Lutheran Congregational Council met with Tracey Moore, Brian Bunkers, Larry Wennekamp, and Bethany Wilke. Denise Stevenson, Dave Groteluschen and Pastor Chris were absent. President Tracey Moore called the meeting to order and led the opening prayer.

Minutes/Financial Reports

Brian made a motion to approve the last meeting minutes. Bethany seconded it. Motion carried. The July financial reports were reviewed. Brian made a motion to approve them. Larry seconded the motion. Motion carried.

-Basement Painting Update-The basement will be painted before Sunday School starts up again. Larry Wennekamp made a motion to approve the painting of the basement for 2,000 to 2,500 coming out of the property/memorial fund. We will split in half. Brian Bunkers seconded the motion. Motion carried.

-Face Painting-Rainbow Trout the Clown will be coming the night of our spaghetti feed to paint kids' faces. We are excited to add this addition to the night. Brian made a motion to approve the face painting of 400 and for it to come out of Evangelism/Christian Ed. Bethany seconded the motion. Motion carried.

New Business

-Church Sign-Brian Bunkers has been in contact with Christ Lutheran Church and Schieffer signs to hopefully get the sign up before our September 10th event.

-**Ecumenical Thanksgiving-**St. John's will be hosting the worship on November 19th at 4:00. This involves St. Luke's, UCC, 1st United Methodist Federated and Grace Episcopal Churches.

Pastor's Report

The visit to the Tri-Faith Commons and attending the Shabbat Service at Temple Israel was a huge success! 13 of us traveled into Omaha, walked the big circle path, called Abraham's Bridge, saw the Tri-Faith Garden and orchard, and saw the 4 buildings connected by that bridge that establishes an intentional interfaith neighborhood of Jews, Christians, and Muslims. We heard from many of the leaders of the Temple concerning the coming together of this community as well as some of the specific practices and beliefs of their Reformed Jewish Tradition. Service consisted of lots of songs, prayers and thoughts from the Senior Rabbi (sound familiar?). What was different was that many of the songs and prayers were sung and spoken in Hebrew, but for those of us who aren't proficient, there were English translations as well.

All who attended enjoyed themselves and learned a lot! We have a second trip planned on Friday October 13, if you missed the first trip or would like to go again. Look for the announcement on the bulletin board.

Plans are well underway for our big Spaghetti Feed on Sept 10 as our project for "God's Work. Our Hands." Sunday. We are excited for this, as well as all the other fun stuff starting this same day (Sunday School, Confirmation, Adult Bible Study, Choirs, etc.).

St. John's Church-Shell Creek Semi-Annual Meeting Minutes July 23, 2023

The Semi-annual meeting of St. John's was held following church services on July, 23rd 2023.

Vice President Brian Bunkers called the meeting to order, and Pastor Chris Alexander led an opening prayer. A quorum was declared present. Brad Luchsinger and Sam Welch were appointed tellers.

The minutes of the January 2023 minutes were read. Sharon Hartman moved and Susan Klug seconded approval of the minutes. Motion passed. The minutes will be placed on file.

The Financial Secretary's report was reviewed. There were no questions on the report. Chris Luchsinger moved to accept the financial secretary's report and Pat Cuda seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Old Business-

-Rose Runge gave an update from the call committee. Rose expressed how there are several other churches looking right now but not enough candidates at this time to fill the request. Our church profile is still active and a discussion on partnerships is being had. We are going to keep praying.

~Bill Luckey asked what the percentage is right now of churches looking for a Pastor. Pastor Chris addressed how important it is to find creative ways to be with each other and sharing worship with one another. Brian Bunkers discussed how as a council we are very open to ideas to partner with other churches. We have hired Rival Design to help promote our church and we are on Facebook now. Open Communication is a BIG component right now moving forward.

~Merle Mueller moved we leave the ELCA in January of 2024. Elaine Hake seconded this. Pastor Chris said we needed to check the constitution for the rules of the timing on when that motion can be made after the last vote...it might be like two years...it was checked and is acceptable...rules say it can be brought up six months after the last vote. The vote will need a 2/3 majority to pass. Then two votes six months apart...the whole process is 2.5 years.

~Doug Hartman addressed his concerns about already having this conversation discussion when we voted the first time to leave the ELCA.

~Denise Stevenson spoke on leaving the ELCA. The ELCA is very open, and she feels that we have many more options. We must get away from the mindset that people will come to us. We need to go out and be exposed. Her biggest take away was having those hard conversations with each other and being in communication with one another.

~After looking in the constitution it stated that we can vote for a termination again after six months.

~Sharon Hartman stated that philosophically should be the reason we should want to leave the ELCA. The ELCA is so much more welcoming and accepting.

~Bill Lucky stated that he is concerned about the youth. We do not have many opportunities to get our youth involved. ~Rose Runge talked about how she is the one with kids here. It's what your getting out of it. Doing plenty of good things here at St. John's. You make your church be whatever you want it to be. Bill Klug made a motion to end the motion on the floor. 2/3 called for a question to end the discussion. The congregation had a hand vote to end the discussion. All in favor of the congregation to end.

~Merle Mueller's proposal ballet to pursue leaving the ELCA (yes to leave, no to stay) The voting results: 27 no 10 yes-37 votes all together. We will not be pursuing leaving the ELCA at this time. Brian Bunkers stated that we may not always agree but we need to be in full communication with each other. We have stepped up as a congregation. Your giving and all of the behind the scenes things that are done have not gone unnoticed. The council appreciates what you do. Pastor Chris has been so helpful along the way and has done lots of pushing for us.

New Business

-Assembly Report-Denise Stevenson reported to the Congregation about the NE Synod Assembly that she and Pastor Chris attended. Denise spoke on going beyond just the walls of your church to help others and stay in communication with each other.

Committee Reports

-Christian Education-Chris Luchsinger reported that the committee is working on Sunday School/VBS Dates/Christmas Program already. Sunday School will begin on September 10th.

-Evangelism-Working on Columbus Days Booth.

-Property-Thank you to those that have really stepped up!

-Stewardship-We will be having a lunch picnic on November 5th. Gathering/talking and eating about what it means to be good Christians in the world.

-Worship & Music-Sharon Hartman reported that they have a Funeral Service Preparation sheet available now to avoid any stress on the families. There will be paper copies available August 6th on the desk out front. A digital copy will be available as well.

-Social Ministry-God's Work Our Hands is September 10th. We are inviting the whole community to join us in a Spaghetti Feed from 5-7. We will be having nonperishable foods brought for the food pantry. This has been a huge event with the help of social ministry/stewardship and evangelism.

Doug Hartman moved to adjourn the meeting with a second from Pat Cuda. Motion carried. The congregation closed with the Lord's Prayer.


